### **DARWIN**

• "When on board HMS. *Beagle*, as naturalist, I was much struck with certain facts in the distribution of the organic beings inhabiting South America, and in the geological relations of the present to the past inhabitants of that continent. These facts ... seemed to throw some light on the origin of species -- that mystery of mysteries ... After five years work I allowed myself to speculate on the subject, and drew up some short notes; these I enlarged in 1844 into a sketch of the conclusions ... from that period to the present day I have steadily pursued the same object."

- Gaffin: The truth of the gospel stands or falls with the historicity of Adam as the first human being from whom all other human beings descend.

### "EVOLUTION OF ADAM"

• Pete Enns: The fact that Paul considered Adam to be progenitor of the human race does not mean that we need to find some way to maintain his view...we have to leave room for the ancient writers of Scripture to reflect and even incorporate their ancient, mistaken cosmologies into their scriptural reflections.







### Retinal Layers




Retinal photoreceptor cell (rod or cone)

### DARWIN'S DOUBT

• "I am inclined," he writes, "to look at everything as resulting from designed laws, with the details, whether good or bad, left to the working out of what we may call chance. Not that this notion at all satisfies me. I feel most deeply that the whole subject is too profound for human intellect. A dog might as well speculate on the mind of Newton."


### SEXISM

• Man is more courageous, pugnacious and energetic than woman, and has a more inventive genius. His brain is absolutely larger, but whether or not proportionately to his larger body, has not, I believe, been fully ascertained...civilisation. The chief distinction in the intellectual powers of the two sexes is shewn by man's attaining to a higher eminence, in whatever he takes up, than can woman—whether requiring deep thought, reason, or imagination, or merely the use of the senses and hands...the average of mental power in man must be above that of woman.
